Hello Everyone!

Welcome to May! May 1st is our church's birthday, and this year it's a big one: 185 years! Can you even believe that the 175th anniversary was already a decade ago? Time moves so quickly, as you know and have experienced!



May 2024

May is a beautiful month and it's also a great month in the lives of pastors. It's a month of taking a breath—after the two busy seasons of Advent and then Lent, May is a month where we celebrate the birth of the church in Pentecost, but it's still less heavy than other months of the year.

This year, Easter was on March 31st, so April was less impacted by the church calendar than it typically is; but it took time to decompress over the great things the church experiences during Advent, Christmas, the buildup to Lent, Lent, Holy Week, and then Easter.

Perhaps your career had similar times of the year that always seemed to be heavier with activities or expectations. And if so, then I'm sure you can relate. And now that we're into May, pastors everywhere can take a deep breath and think about "Okay, God, where are You leading me in my leadership. And where are you leading the church?"

I've found this reflective time to be a key aspect of staying inspired and excited for the things coming up in the church community through the summer and into the fall, when the church is in "ordinary time."

So now, since we're past the setbacks of the past, the question becomes: where is God leading us moving forward? In what ways can we continue to be Christ's hands and feet with the realities of our church now?

I invite you to think about this, pray about this, consider this, and then share with a member of Session what comes to mind (if anything). One of the beautiful things of our polity (church structure) is that everyone has the same connection to God, which means God can and does use us all for God's glory!

Enjoy your springtime—now that it's well established—and I'm excited to hear what God has brought forth from amongst us!

Sunday school runs from 9:30 – 10:15 a.m., for Pre-K through Adult, September through June. Please see Ashley Ziccardi if you have any questions.


Pastoral Care




